1)	Go to www.YouTube.com	

- 2) To find the subject matter needed, type in the YouTube search area the topic that is needed.
- 3) In this example, Andy Warhol is the subject information needed. A list of topics will appear as you type.
- 4) The Andy Warhol documentary is the best for the lesson. Move the cursor to the documentary (it will turn gray) and click on it.
- 5) A list of documentaries will be displayed. Note in the upper right corner, there are about 24,800 results. Scroll down to see the multiple results.
- 6) The choice that seems to fit the best is "Modern Masters- Andy Warhol (BBC Documentary).
 Note that the length of the clip is in the lower right corner.
- 7) Click on the blue letters and the video clip will start. Remember to have the speakers and sound enabled on the computer.
- 8) At any time, if the video is not to the liking, use the back button of the browser to go back to the list.
- 9) Once the suitable video is found, note the length of time it must play for the lesson.
- 10) To save this video for later viewing, there are three ways to do this:
 - a) Bookmark the web page if using Google Chrome
 - b) Save the web page to favorites if using Internet Explorer
 - c) Select the watch later and create a login for YouTube
